Instructions for the walk

Parking

There is a large car park at the back of St. Mary's Church and a small one at the rear of the 110 Club. Both the church and the club are situated on Yorkshire Street, Burnley, BB10 4AU.

Walking Route

Turn **LEFT** out of St. Mary's Church gate on Yorkshire Street. Head down Yorkshire Street towards the town centre. Turn **LEFT** at the Gala Bingo hall on the roundabout Take an immediate **LEFT** after the Gala Bingo hall car park. Head up the steps onto the Leeds-Liverpool canal and turn **LEFT**

Continue until you cross the aqueduct over the River Brun. Descend, bear left and pass under the aqueduct. Follow the riverside upstream along the Brun Valley Greenway for approximately 700m through Bank Hall Park under Queen Victoria Road and past Heasandford Allotments.

Turn **LEFT** onto Netherwood Road. 100m on by Heasandford House look for the oak carved marker and turn **RIGHT** up the lane. After 50m turn right onto the woodland track. Continue east for 1km along the track. When you leave the woodland cross Netherwood Bridge.

Once across the bridge turn **RIGHT** into the woodland footpath towards Rowley Lake. A car will be stationed to guide you. Follow the trail by the river and then by Rowley Lake crossing the river bridge at the far end. Then follow the footpath back up the other side of the lake and through the Brun Valley Forest Park eventually rejoining Netherwood Road immediately after the footbridge. Again a car will be present. Turn **LEFT** and retrace the route back towards town.

Refreshments will be available after the walk in KSC 110 Club across the road from St. Mary's Church.
